

College Policy Change Guide

Do you know what happens at your school if a student becomes pregnant? What are the rules? Are there policies that help her choose life or would the rules make her consider abortion? Follow this guide and you can help your school become more accommodating to pregnant and parenting students!

As we prepare for a Post-Roe America, we need to make sure every student is given support and life-affirming options from their school if they find out they're pregnant.

Schools that receive federal funding must abide by Title IX, which makes discrimination against pregnant or parenting students illegal! Let's help schools support pregnant and parenting students with these three steps.



- 1 All public and private schools receiving any Federal funds must comply with Title IX, yet some private institutions have exemptions. Get to know your school administrators and available resources. Learn about their key policies to determine Title IX compliancy or exemption status.
